The construction works will include the construction of the WSF, namely the construction of the dam and the reservoir basin bowl. Construction of an operational site with a single-family house, construction of a 10kV electricity power line (8.3 km) and a 0.4 kV on-site power line.

Preparatory works are envisaged:

- Construction of a dirt road from the village to the dam site (7.5km) with pipe crossings over temporary logs;
- Passing diverted flow;
- Removal of brush and trees.

The usable capacity of the reservoir is 2.85 million m3. The dam is located 7.5 km from the existing intake structure on the Tugel Sai River. The dam is made of local soil material with a core of loam. The maximum height of the dam is 31.6m. The length of the dam along the crest is 192m.

Construction of structures on the dam is envisaged:

- Bed drainage at the base of the dam body;
- Catastrophic spillway made of monolithic reinforced concrete and discharge channel (187m);
- Operational water outlet made of steel pipes d=1600mm in two lines (255m) and gate chambers with hydromechanical equipment;
- Measuring equipment and benchmarks;
- Relocation of existing unpaved road from flooded area;
- Operational roadways.

Objective and Purpose of the Assignment

The Government of Tajikistan has requested the Asian Development Bank's (ADB) assistance to improve transportations of CAREC corridors 2, 5, and 6 by upgrading the Dushanbe Kurgonteppa road, for which ADB has programmed two projects in 2016 and 2018. The first project that improved 33 km of the road from Dushanbe to Chashmasoron was approved on 31 October 2016 and completed on 31 July 2022. The second project was approved on 27 March 2018 and focuses on improving an approximately 40-km section of the 82 km Dushanbe-Kurgonteppa road from Chashmasoron to Kurgonteppa. The second project scheduled for completion by 31 December 2023. Within the second project (Additional Financing) consulting assignment for development/updating of specifications are being provided that will improve the technical specifications of the road industry.

Introduction

- 1. With ADB and other development partner assistance the Government of Tajikistan is undertaking a major program of improving the country's primary highway network. The agency responsible for the network is the Ministry of Transport (MOT).
- 2. These improvement activities have been financed as a series of separate projects, with civil works generally implemented by international contractors supervised by teams of international and I. national consultants. Referring to the ADB-financed projects specifically, the civil works have been implemented under FIDIC Conditions of Contract, the relevant MDB version. The supervision consultants have been the Engineer for these contracts, as defined in the Conditions of Contract.

Civil works procurement documentation has followed the ADB's sample bidding documents for large civil works contracts, in particular for the commercial provisions – Instructions to Bidders, Conditions of Contract, standard forms and schedules, etc. The current version of this documentation can be found on the ADB website .

- 3. The Employer's requirements of this documentation include drawings, technical specifications, special provisions, Bills of Quantities (BOQs), and others that are project specific. These Terms of Reference refer to the technical specifications and to the Bills of Quantities that relate to them.
- 4. Most of the completed and ongoing road improvement projects make use of a set of highway construction technical specifications that were developed with ADB assistance in the early 2000s for use on ADB and other development partner financed road projects. They were based on the 1993 edition of the AASHTO Guide Specifications for Highway Construction. Since the specifications were prepared many aspects of highway construction have changed, the

controlling Conditions of Contract have been amended several times, and Tajikistan's road management agency, the MOT, has very significantly increased its capacity in managing roadworks undertaken through ADB and other development partner assisted projects.

- 5. Reflecting these factors, it is now necessary to prepare a replacement for the original technical specifications. This activity, to which these Terms of Reference apply, is to be done by a team of international and national consultants (the consultant) provided by a firm, and selected by MOT in accordance with the provisions of ADB's Procurement Policy (2017, as amended from time to time) and Procurement Regulations for ADB Borrowers (2017, as amended from time to time).
- 6. The consultant will undertake the following broadly defined tasks, and such other related tasks as MOT might require:
- (i) Review the existing technical specification, and all the subsequent road project specifications that have been based on it, most of which have introduced amendments to or clarifications of the original document, to the extent that much of the logic of the specifications has been lost;
- (ii) assess the suitability of relevant international technical specifications for highway construction, including the up to date version of the AASHTO Guide Specifications for Highway Construction;
- (iii) discuss with MOT, ADB and other relevant agencies the likely nature of future road project operations, to include standard major highway improvement projects, periodic maintenance implemented by national contractors for example performance based maintenance approaches, and other modalities if relevant;
- (iv) prepare a draft technical specification that will:
- a. Be consistent with the current FIDIC-based Conditions of Contract (FIDIC Red Book (2017) that are for ADB and other development partner financed road construction projects;
- b. Provide for all likely types of work that would-be part of typical road construction projects—earthworks, tunnels, pavements, structures, traffic facilities, environmental impact management, and others as appropriate;
- c. Contain appropriate measurement and payment provisions for each of the work types;
- d. Reflect current best international practices for such projects;
- (v) Prepare a draft template BOQs that are compatible with the draft technical specification, and are substantially less complex than the BOQs now in use, in terms of numbers of work items, descriptions of the work items, etc;
- (vi) Arrange workshops and discussion groups to introduce the draft documents to MOT, government agencies involved with procurement activities (to include the Ministry of Finance, the State Committee, and others as appropriate), and to ADB and other interested development partners;

- (vii) On the basis of feedback from these workshops and discussions, prepare final draft versions of the documents for comment and, after receiving comments on them, prepare them in final form;
- (viii) Assist MOT with obtaining formal Government approval of the documents, if this is required, so that they may be adopted for all future ADB and other development partner financed projects and, to the extent possible, for MOT's own budget financed.

Schedule

7. It is anticipated that the consultant will be selected by the end of March 2023, and will commence the assignment by the end of April 2023. The assignment duration will be approximately 4 months.

Outputs

- 8. The outputs of the assignment will be as set out above. In addition, the consultant will prepare brief progress reports each month, for submission to MOT and ADB.
- V. Consultant's Expertise
- 9. The consultant will be headed by a Team Leader, who will be a civil engineer with at least 15 years of relevant experience in preparing and implementing, as a supervising consultant or as a contractor, contracts for major road construction contracts. Relevance for this assignment will include extensive experience on projects in countries with similar institutional and physical characteristics to those present in Tajikistan, financed by ADB or similar international financing agencies.
- 10. The Team Leader will manage inputs provided by relevant international and national technical specialists as the consultant considers necessary for the assignment. The determination of appropriate expertise will be at the discretion of the consultant, but is likely to include road and pavement works, road structures, road-related environmental impact management, road safety, and others.
- 11. The Team Leader's input, of 4 person-months, will be full time in Dushanbe, with visits to project sites as appropriate. The inputs of the technical specialists will be about 4 personmonths for international team members, generally working in the consultant's home office, and about 8 person-months for national specialists, in Dushanbe.

MOT Support

12. MOT will provide the consultant with (i) furnished office accommodation in MOT's office in Dushanbe, and (ii) copies of documents, contracts, and reports as necessary. The consultant will provide, through its contract, (i) a vehicle with driver for the duration of the assignment; (ii) all computer, communications, and other facilities necessary; (iii) venues for

workshops and discussion group meetings; and (iv) all international and national travel requirements.

Learning from the best - How Japanese construct buildings that survive earthquake

There is one country which is decades ahead of the rest of the world when it comes to making its buildings resilient. Japan is world-renowned for its earthquake-proof buildings. With feats of modern engineering, Japan's earthquake proof buildings have helped the country cope with numerous powerful quakes that would have been calamitous in other, less well-prepared countries.

Resilient construction is now firmly on the agenda right around the world. Whether it's floods in Europe, wildfires in Australia, hurricanes in the United States or rising sea levels in South Asia, architects, engineers and governments are accelerating efforts to protect infrastructure from natural and manmade disasters.

So, how can we make buildings earthquake-proof, Japanese-style, and what can other nations learn from the country's experience?



Why is Japan a leader in earthquake proof buildings?

Japan's finesse at designing earthquake-proof buildings is born largely of necessity. The island nation sits on what is known as the Pacific Ring of Fire, a zone where the Eurasian, Pacific and Philippine tectonic plates are forced beneath one another. This enormous pressure periodically results in a huge release of energy — resulting in the archipelago's earthquakes.

Japan has suffered earthquakes throughout its history, with one of the worst being the **Great Kanto Earthquake** of 1923. The quake reached 7.9 on the Richter scale, devastated Tokyo and Yokohama and killed over 140,000 people.

After WWII, the Japanese government introduced a series of increasingly strict measures to force builders to make earthquake proof structures (this was especially important as buildings were growing taller). Japan's earthquake proof building standards are as follows:

Taishin: This is the minimum requirement for earthquake resistant buildings in Japan, and mandates that beams, pillars and walls be of a minimum thickness to cope with shaking.

Seishin: The next level of earthquake-proof buildings in Japan, Seishin is recommended for high rise buildings. It uses dampers that absorb much the energy of an earthquake. Essentially, layers of thick rubber maps are placed on the ground below the foundations, thereby absorbing tremors.

Menshin: This is the most advanced form of earthquake proof buildings in Japan, and also the most expensive. The building structure itself is isolated from the ground by layers of lead, steel and rubber which move independently with the earth below. This means the building itself moves very little – even during the most severe quakes.

Common earthquake-proof features in Japanese buildings

Depending on the location and purpose of the building, Japanese architects may pick and choose between many other earthquake proof building features including:

The use of a steel frame in the building's core — as opposed to the reinforced concrete core common in Western structures

The use of diagonal dampers, steel beams and columns rather than concrete columns

Pendulums in the core or on the roof of the building

Dampers installed between the levels of the building

Mesh structures to help to fortify the building

Made-to-break T-joints

Many new buildings are also connected to the country's early warning system, which alerts inhabitants of an oncoming quake

Use of fall-away doors which provide more ways to escape

Covered lights to protect people in case light bulbs explode

While smart and energy-efficient buildings tend to grab headlines, in countries like Japan where earthquakes are a regular event, these important factors are often downgraded to 'nice-to-haves' behind the need for structural stability.

It's no secret that a building's foundations are critical to its resilience, and with earthquakes and other natural disasters seemingly happening more frequently than ever, the demand for resilient buildings is also growing.

Japan's proximity to the Pacific 'Ring of Fire' and all its seismic activity has contributed to the country's strict building codes for skyscrapers and towers. Thanks in part to materials that are flexible and shock-absorbent as well as modern tools to test and analyze the performance of a building, the architecture and engineering seen in Japan is among the most resilient in the world, with even some older buildings retrofitted to make them more earthquake-resistant.

This dedication to structural stability has made Japan a prime example of an earthquake-ready country.

Examples of Japan's earthquake-proof buildings


All buildings in Japan today must conform to the country's strict earthquake proof building codes. Here are some examples of innovative structures that meet the standards:

Shinjuku Mitsui Building



Absorbing the power of earthquakes is not only something to think about on new builds. In the example of the Shinjuku Mitsui Building, also in Tokyo, several 300-tonne pendulums were retrofitted on the skyscraper's roof. The pendulums rock back and forth during a quake which helps counteract the building's side-to-side movement.

Air Danshin's 'floating' homes



Japanese company Air Danshin has created a unique solution to the problem of earthquakes: levitation! The residential homes are fitted out with a quake detector. If it registers a tremor, a compressor pushes air into a space beneath the building, lifting it one to three centimeters from the building's foundation. This makes it impossible for the building to shake and therefore helps avoid damage.

Mori Tower



The 54-story Mori Tower is located within the Roppongi Hills complex in Tokyo. Its earthquake-resistant features include reinforced steel piping and a motionabsorbing technology called oil dampers. The dampers used in the building are semi-active and consists of 192 shock absorbers which are filled with thick oil. When the building shakes during an earthquake, the dampers counterbalance the shaking with the oil sliding in the opposite direction to minimize the tremors.

Tokyo Skytree

The Tokyo Skytree is a television and radio transmitter and observation tower located in Sumida, Tokyo. Completed in 2012, it stands at 2,080 feet and takes its design inspiration from the root system of a giant tree. It has a tripod base with a central pillar connected by flexible oil dampers to the first 125 meters. The central pillar acts as a counterweight which allows the outer frame to vibrate in the event of an earthquake; a damping system keeps the tower's center of gravity close to the base. The foundations are also designed to be resilient to earthquakes, with four clusters of walled piles and steel-reinforced concrete nodes reaching 164 feet below the ground to give the tower a firm footing.

Ark Hills Sengokuyama

This is a mixed-use building in Tokyo that uses the same damping technology to make it earthquake-proof. Steel plates are installed in the cavities between each floor. These plates are attached to the upper wall of the cavities and the lower wall is fitted with oil dampers. During an earthquake, the plates move through the oil dampers which creates a resisting force against the seismic activity.

fa-bo

found in Noma City in the Ishikawa Prefecture, fa-bo is an office and laboratory building of Komatsu Seiren, a Japanese textile firm. The three-story office building is enveloped by a curtain of 1,031 braided carbon fiber rods which extend from the roof and are fastened to the ground at various angles. The rods are tough and flexible and capable of protecting the building in the event of an earthquake. Inside this curtain of rods is another layer of 2,778 rods that add stability to the building.

When there is an earthquake and the building shifts from side to side, the rods stretch and pull it back to prevent it from shaking.

Television House

Situated in the Osaka Prefecture, Television House is a private home designed to be earthquake-resistant. It is integrated with a seismic isolation system and load bearing arrangement that keeps the building steady during earthquakes. The house sits on a podium with elevated structural beams and a concrete base which acts as the ground floor. A hollow base serves as the entrance to the house. The isolators enable the house to be separated from any ground tremors.

Silent guardians

The high rises of Tokyo, Osaka and Yokohama dominate the cityscapes around them. The towers give the impression of being as immovable and steadfast as a human-made structure can be.

These towers are the fixed backdrop to daily urban life in Japan, as they are in any large and developed city in the world. While people and traffic bustle around them, they are fixed and still – the pins that hold the rest of the hectic city together.

It takes an earthquake to reveal that perspective to be an illusion. In Japan, skyscrapers have to be able to move.

Continuous threats

The 2011 Tokohu earthquake is known as one of the most devastating in recent times. But it was just one of many seismic events that strike Japan each year.

The Japanese archipelago rests along the Pacific Ring of Fire, at the margins of the Eurasian, Philippine and Pacific tectonic plates. At the margin, one tectonic plate is forced beneath the other, causing a build-up of extraordinary pressures. An earthquake is the release, sending vibrations strong enough to raze an ordinary city to the ground.

Here we can see the Kyushu highway, damaged by a 6.4-magnitude quake in 2016.

Setting the bar

But the tower blocks of Japan are not ordinary buildings. All buildings — even if they are small or temporary structures — must be resilient to earthquakes in the country, says Jun Sato, a structural engineer and associate professor at the University of Tokyo.

There are two main levels of resilience that engineers work towards: the first is to withstand smaller earthquakes, the type that a building might see three or four times in its lifespan in Japan. For this magnitude, any damage that requires repair is not acceptable. The building should be so well designed that it can escape these earthquakes unscathed.

The second level of resilience is withstanding extreme earthquakes, which are rarer. The bar is set by the Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923. This was a large earthquake – of magnitude 7.9 – that devastated Tokyo and Yokohama, and killed more than 140,000 people.

For earthquakes of a greater magnitude than this benchmark, preserving buildings perfectly is no longer the goal. Any damage that does not cause a human casualty is acceptable.

"You design buildings to protect people's lives," says Ziggy Lubkowski, a seismic specialist at University College London. "That's the minimum requirement."

Shock absorbers

To withstand the incredible forces of an earthquake, buildings have to absorb as much seismic energy as possible.

"When the structure can absorb all the energy [from the earthquake], it will not collapse," says Sato.

This mainly happens in a process called seismic isolation. The buildings or structures are put on a form of bearing or shock absorber – sometimes as simple as blocks of rubber about 30-50cm (12 to 20in) thick – to resist the motions of the earthquake. Wherever the building columns come down to the foundation, they sit on these rubber pads.

Top-to-toe resilience

Adaptations to the base of the building are one of the main ways that buildings are made to withstand earthquakes. But motion dampers throughout the height of the building can also improve resilience.

"A tall building may move 1.5m (5ft) but if you put dampers at certain levels – every second floor all the way up to the top – you can reduce that motion to a much smaller amount, preventing damage to the superstructure," says Lubkowski.

The dampers tend to look something like a bicycle pump, except it's filled with liquid instead of air.

"As you compress the pump, it pushes against the liquid. It doesn't compress very much but it will move a little bit. That process can reduce the vibrations within the building."


Elegance and safety

Complex devices to absorb the energy of an earthquake and ease shaking aren't the only way to make a building resilient to earthquakes. Other methods involve the layout and design of the building itself. "Ideally what we want is to make the building as regular as possible," says Lubkowski. "If you have each floor at exactly the same height and all the columns on an even grid spacing, the building will perform better in an earthquake."

But often the designers of spectacular skyscrapers are reluctant to make those kinds of compromises, and tensions between the seismic standards required by engineers and the creative visions of architects are common.

"There are always big conflicts between us," says NorihiroEjiri, representative director of the Tokyo-based firm Ejiri Structural Engineers. "Fortunately in Japan, architects are also educated about earthquakes, so engineers and designers are able to discuss with common sense."

The Skytree Tower in Tokyo is the second tallest building in the world. It is built in a 'neofuturistic' style that incorporates some elements of the traditional Japanese pagoda, and includes a central pillar attached to seismic dampers that can together absorb the energy of an earthquake.

Protective mesh

Sato has worked on developing seismic engineering solutions that are both functional and elegant. "When I discuss the structural designs with architects, I always look for a way to harmonise seismic elements into overall design of the building," he says.

"Sometimes I can find how to embed those elements into the floor plan, sometimes I can develop transparent or translucent elements, sometimes I can find the geometry in their sketches which can be developed into seismic elements."

For example, using mesh structures helps prevent the building's supports buckling. If one part buckles, having a close neighbour helps stop it bending and distributes the energy absorption. As a result, mesh structures — which can also be very beautiful — help to fortify buildings. Here we see a steel mesh, used in Hakodate Future University, designed by Riken Yamamoto.


Evolving designs

The goal of creating earthquake-proof buildings is not static. Researchers estimate how future earthquakes might impact a building by observing active faults. But the magnitude of earthquakes in the region appears to be getting larger, so prediction becomes even more difficult, says Ejiri.

But could tomorrow's buildings withstand even the largest earthquakes unscathed?

"Within reason, yes, such buildings should be possible. The sorts of base isolation systems, bearings, braces, damped outrigger systems that we use will achieve that," says Lubkowski.

The answer lies in gradually testing all the known technologies we have to stabilise buildings, while trialling ever more creative designs, such as mesh structures. Sometimes small, experimental structures — such as an elaborate polyhedral mesh designed to resist buckling at NaoshimaPavillion, Kagawa (designed by Sou Fujimoto) — can add to the engineers' repertoire.

Conclusion:

Japan is admired around the world for its high-tech innovations in multiple fields, and when it comes to resilience in its infrastructure, it is certainly at the cutting edge. So, what can other countries facing natural and manmade disasters learn from Japan's approach to earthquake resilience?

Strong regulation is vital: Clear laws about minimum standards for resilience mean that Japanese builders know what to deliver. This also gives customers more security and confidence.

Innovation is essential: Japanese designers are continually innovating to make even more sophisticated earthquake proof buildings.

Investment is critical: Building earthquake-proof building costs up to 20% more than a standard structure. Yet, in the long run, this approach saves owners money since their buildings are safe from damage when earthquakes strike.



Monthly Commercial Report: January 2023

Overview

Saudi Arabia's real gross domestic product (GDP) jumped by 5.4 percent year-on-year (YoY) in the fourth quarter of 2022 according to the data issued on January 31, by the General Authority for Statistics.

The economic growth was driven by a **significant increase in oil activities by 6.1 percent YoY and 6.2 percent rise in non-oil activities**. Meanwhile, government activities increased by 1.8 percent YoY.

The seasonally adjusted real GDP increased by 1.5 percent in the fourth quarter of 2022, compared to the third quarter of this year. The rise is due to the positive growth witnessed by non-oil activities by 1.7 percent, government services activities by 0.5 percent while oil activities decreased by 0.3 percent QoQ.

Saudi Arabia's economy grew by 8.7% in 2022 compared to the previous year, according to flash estimates posted by the General Authority for Statistics (GASTAT).

Saudi pharmaceuticals industry covers 30% of Middle East market

The market size of the pharmaceuticals industry in Saudi Arabia reached SR32 billion (\$8.6 billion), the largest in the region accounting for more than 30% of the Middle East market, according to Minister of Industry and Mineral Resources Bandar Al-Khorayef.

Al-Khorayef reiterated, during his participation in the ministerial dialogue session at the Riyadh Global Medical Biotechnology Summit on Wednesday, that the Kingdom follows a strategic approach and comprehensive plan to build the best infrastructure for biotechnology at a global level to attract the best talent, promote innovation, and lead the country globally in health care and life sciences. (January 26)

Saudi Arabia will invest \$266 billion in clean energy, says Saudi Energy Minister.

Saudi Arabia will invest up to one trillion riyals (\$266.40 billion) to generate "cleaner energy", Saudi state TV reported on January 30, citing the kingdom's energy minister. Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman added that the investments aim also to "add transport lines and distribution networks in order to eventually export the energy to the world and produce clean hydrogen."

Saudi Arabia's commercial engagements

Saudi -Italy

Saudi Arabia, Italy sign MoU to increase trade exchange. On January 27, the Saudi Export-Import Bank signed a memorandum of understanding with the Italian Export Credit Agency (SACE) which aims to empower Saudi exporters and international investors and enhance the Saudi-Italian trade exchange. The agreement aims at establishing a framework for mutual reinsurance in a way that

enhances the presence of Saudi products in Italian markets, and it opens horizons for cooperation in areas of professional development, transfer of knowledge of best practices in export credit, and cooperation in international projects that utilize the Saudi and Italian resources in line with the economic goals of the two parties.

Saudi -India

Agreement worth \$1 billion signed to manufacture specialized, agricultural chemicals in Saudi Arabia. On January 21, the Ministry of Investment has signed an investment agreement to manufacture specialized and agricultural chemicals in Saudi Arabia, with a value estimated at \$1 billion. The ministry has signed the agreement with the Indian company UPL, which comes within the Kingdom' efforts in supporting the qualitative investments, and economic diversification. It is noteworthy that the agreement was signed on the sidelines of the participation of Saudi Arabia's delegation in the World Economic Forum 2023, which is held in Davos, Switzerland.

Saudi - Switzerland

Saudi-Swiss Economic Committee discusses investment, economic, trade cooperation, January 18, 2023

The 13th meeting of the joint Saudi-Swiss Economic Committee and the Saudi-Swiss Investment Forum was held here Wednesday with the attendance of Minister of Investment Eng. Khalid Bin Abdulaziz Al-Falih and Federal Councilor Guy Parmelin, head of the Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education, and Research. The Saudi-Swiss Investment Forum's works included presentations on business opportunities in the Kingdom, international supply chains, national industry strategy, and Swiss infrastructure expertise. The forum saw the signing of an agreement to establish and inaugurate the first independent international company to operate and administrate hotels in the Kingdom and another agreement for a joint precious metals project, in addition to four memorandums of understanding in the tourism, hospitality, and health sectors.

Saudi – Pakistan

Saudi Arabia provides \$1bln to finance Pakistan's oil derivatives

Saudi Arabia will finance the purchase of oil derivatives worth \$1 billion to support Pakistan's economy, sector growth, and navigating economic challenges.

An agreement in this respect was signed in Islamabad on January 12, 2023 between the Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) and the Economic Affairs Division of Pakistan.

Saudi Press Agency (SPA) said that the agreement comes as an extension of the \$4.44 billion support provided previously in 2019 and 2021, to finance oil derivatives, through the Saudi Fund for Development with the Pakistani Ministry of Economy, after the issuance of generous directives that reflect the continuation of the close relationship between the two countries.

The Saudi Side has subsequently shared the draft terms of reference for negotiation of FTA on Dec 27, 2021. One round of negotiation between the two sides happened on Feb 02, 2021. Additional trade data was requested from the Indian side to be shared with GCC Secretariat via NV No. RIY/E&C/204/09/2021.

This Mission had received an NV from GCC Secretariat, dated 26th June 2022, requesting updates on resumption of FTA Negotiation and it has been forwarded to M/o Commerce for information.

SS(Com) met with GCC's official contact i.r.o FTA on July 21, 2022. A virtual meeting was also organised between MoCl and GCC, wherein it was decided to exchange the trade data requested and finalisation of ToR.

Both sides committed to the early launch of GCC FTA negotiations during the visits of EAM & CIM to Riyadh in September, 2022.

During the visit of GCC, Secretary General on November 24, 2022 to India, an announcement was made of intent to resume talks on India-GCC FTA
