#### Monthly Commercial Report: December 2022

##### Overview

Saudi Arabia's real gross domestic product (GDP) jumped by 8.8 percent year-on-year (YoY) in the third quarter of 2022 according to the data issued on December 31, by the General Authority for Statistics.

The economic growth was driven by a **significant increase in oil activities by 14.2 percent YoY and 6 percent rise in non-oil activities**. Meanwhile, government activities increased by 2.5 percent YoY.

The seasonally adjusted real GDP increased by 2.1 percent in the third quarter of 2022, compared to the second quarter of this year. The rise is due to the positive growth witnessed by oil activities by 4.5 percent, government services activities by 1.5 percent while non-oil activities decreased by 0.5 percent.

##### Saudi –Spain

**Saudi Arabia and Spain sign deal to build combat ships for Royal Saudi Navy.** On **December 01**, it was reported that Saudi Arabia's Ministry of Defense and the General Authority for Military Industries (GAMI) signed a memorandum of understanding with the Spanish Navantia Co. to acquire and build a number of multi-mission combat ships for the Royal Saudi Naval Forces (RSNF). The deal was signed in the presence of Minister of Defense Prince Khalid bin Salman and Spain's Minister of Industry, Trade and Tourism María Reyes Maroto.

#### **Saudi –UAE**

**Saudi Arabia and UAE sign MoU for mutual recognition of maritime training and certification of competency of seafarers.** On **December 06**, it was reported that Saudi-Emirati Coordination Council, the UAE Ministry of Energy and Infrastructure (MOEI) and the Transport General Authority (TGA) in of Saudi Arabia signed a MoU for mutual recognition of maritime certificates issued in both countries. This is in accordance with the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watch-keeping for Seafarers (STCW) 1978, and its amendments.

#### **Saudi – China**

1. **Saudi and China sign 34 investment agreements during Xi's visit.** As reported by SPA on **December 08** that Saudi and Chinese companies have signed 34 investment agreements during the start of Chinese President Xi Jinping three-day visit to the Saudi Arabia. On December 07 evening dozens of agreements were signed between Saudi and China covering several sectors in the fields of green energy, green hydrogen, photovoltaic energy, information technology, cloud services, transportation, logistics, medical industries, housing and construction factories. According to Federation of Saudi Chambers report, the volume of trade exchange between the two countries amounted to SAR304 billion (\$80 billion) in 2021, and trade exchange in the third quarter of 2022 recorded SAR103 billion (\$270 million). As reported by SPA, Saudi Minister of Energy Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman said that Saudi Arabia will host a regional center for Chinese factories.

2. **Saudi Arabia signs MoU with Huawei.** On **December 08**, Saudi Arabia signs MoU with China's Huawei. Saudi Arabia signed a memorandum of understanding with China's Huawei Technologies on cloud computing and building high-tech complexes in Saudi cities.

3. **Saudi Aramco signs MoU with Shandong Energy on downstream projects in China.** On **December 09**, Saudi Aramco has signed an initial agreement with China's Shandong Energy Group to supply crude oil and chemical products. The scope of the MoU extends to cooperation across technologies related to hydrogen, renewables and carbon capture and storage.

### **Buy Material from Local Vendors**

While purchasing materials for construction try to purchase from local vendors because it will reduce your transportation cost as the transportation of construction material is costly.

### **Saving in Labor Cost**

Labor cost is also a large part of the construction which cannot be cut easily. But try to calculate the works in hours how much labor will be required to finish work and how much time. In this way you can save your cost by estimating the labor cost otherwise the labor will work according to their time and you have to expense more

### **Saving in Machinery Cost**

Construction machines are always hired on a rental basis and their rental cost is too high. So try to take maximum advantage of construction machinery in a calculated way by which construction costs can be saved. By taking care of this point you can save costs in construction.

### **Saving in Flooring**

Flooring can be done both costly or economically. Tiles come in a wide pricing range. Select one of them according to your budget. Also, cement flooring is a great option for reducing cost and is one of the long-lasting floorings. Red oxide flooring is also a good option.

### **Saving in Wooden Work**

As far as possible, if there is no essential need for wooden work try to avoid it. You can also try to avoid the use of costly woods for construction. Instead, you can use a jackfruit tree, wild jack (jungle jack), and similar wood most available in your place to reduce the total cost of wood up to 50%.
